## Volunteer Opportunities

### San Pedro Park Wilderness Backpack ( )

**Friday, July 10 through Wednesday, July 15, 2009**

This will be a trail maintenance operation (brushing, cutting logs blocking the trail, etc) in San Pedro Parks, probably on the San Jose Trail, and we will work for the Cuba Ranger District. The USFS will carry in our camp, kitchen, tools and a small amount of gear per person, such as your tent, sleeping bag, pad, and clothing. All food will be provided except Friday lunch. The campsite will be in the wilderness at about 10,000' and will involve a 6-mile hike, with a 2000' elevation gain. The leader will personally guide participants to the campsite.

If you can't or don't want to do all 6 days, shorter hikes can be accommodated; just please tell me in advance.

**Stuff to Bring:** Your own plate, cup and eating utensils, long-sleeved shirt, long pants, good raingear, insect repellent, sunscreen, tent, sleeping bag and mat, cold weather clothing, lunch and water for the hike in, leather work gloves, boots, and USFS-approved eye protection (available at Lowe's). Be prepared for freezing temperatures.

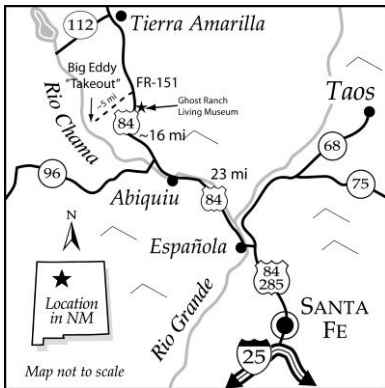
We will meet Friday morning at 9:15 am at the USFS Cuba RD office, which is just off the right side of US 550 (as you drive NW into Cuba) at the city limits. It is a one-story office with brick and green siding. There is a tiny sign on US 550 indicating its presence. If you need a ride, I will facilitate carpooling. Notify me when you make your reservation. At the office in Cuba we will drop off our gear then caravan to the trailhead for our hike in.

**This trip is limited to 8 participants.** Three people have already made reservations. I would be very happy if you can make your reservations before July 5 so that I can plan menus and purchase food.

July is in the beginning of the rainy season in San Pedro Parks and we will probably have afternoon showers most days. We must comply with all USFS safety regulations. The USFS will provide hard hats for when we work.

## Rio Chama Raft Trip (↖↗), Friday, July 17 through Sunday, July 19, 2008

This project is a wonderful opportunity to experience a raft trip down a beautiful river. Working with the BLM (who supply the rafts, kayaks, and river expertise) we will paddle and float down the wild and scenic Chama River from just below El Vado Dam to our work sites. This trip takes us to an area that most people have to win a lottery to see! We will get to see and hear wonderful birds and interesting mammals and reptiles. We will be constructing steps to campsites, camping both Friday and Saturday nights. We meet at Big Eddy on Forest Road 151 (FR 151 heads west from 84 between Ghost Ranch and Echo Amphitheater) on Friday July 11th at 8 AM. We will finish on Sunday afternoon July 12th taking out below the monastery or perhaps going further down river to Big Eddy to experience the rapids. Group meals begin with Friday supper. **This year's project is full** (it's limited to just 8 volunteers) but experienced VFO members are encouraged to sign up early in 2009 for next year's trip.

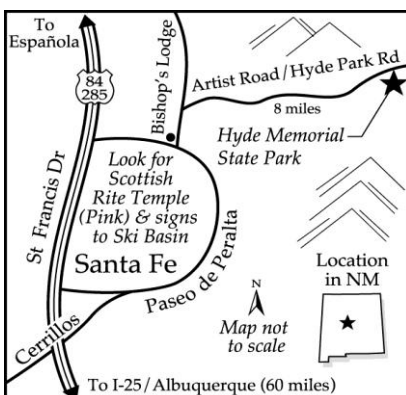

## Some Reminders for Project Volunteers

Just a reminder to volunteers that while the NMVFO provides some meals on our projects, we don't always pack extra plates, cups, and eating utensils. *Project participants should come prepared with their own eating gear. Also, please remember that after meals, volunteers should help with cleanup.* NMVFO cooks spend time planning, shopping and preparing our meals. To this add the extra time to gather equipment and clean it before return to storage and you can begin to understand the work that's entailed. If you are not the type who wants to wash plates and other items, please bring your own disposable eating gear. (But this doesn't relieve you of helping to clean the cooking gear!) *Remember, just like you, our cooks are all volunteers and a thank-you for a meal well done helps keep them cooking for us.* Another item that is often overlooked by volunteers is a chair (folding, collapsible, or whatever). *Please don't assume that an unoccupied chair is "fair game" and was hauled to the campsite for your use because you forgot to bring one.*

## Need Camping Equipment?

VFO has a dome tent, a 0° sleeping bag and foam mattress pad available on a first-come, first-served basis; check with the project leader if you want to borrow them. Another source is REI, in Albuquerque near I-25 and Montano and in Santa Fe at the Railyard; they have a wealth of camping (and other) equipment for rent, including tents, sleeping bags, and sleeping pads.
